Dues increase proposal to be discussed today

Club members will vote today on a proposal from the Board of Directors to increase annual dues to \$88, or \$22 a quarter, from the current \$80. The increase is needed to cover the annual dues payments to Rotary District 6060 and Rotary International and the subscription costs to *The Rotarian* magazine

Currently, the club pays a total of \$81 in dues and subscription costs, which includes \$49 for Rotary International dues, \$20 for District dues, and \$12 for the magazine. This amount will increase over the next four years. District 6060 delegates recently voted to increase annual dues by \$5, effective July 1, the first increase in seven years. Meanwhile, international dues will increase by \$1 annually, starting in 2011-12, for three consecutive years.
